

  - Once classes begin, CUPFA should be notified of any dangerous traffic issues that should be brought to University's attention.

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  - Students who are registered for an in-person course are expected to attend in-person classes and write in-person evaluations.

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#### ► Response:

- ► Students who are registered for an in-person course are expected to attend in-person classes and write in-person evaluations.
- Profs who wish to accommodate students with lecture notes or other material do so at their discretion.

- ► Concern: Accommodation of students NOT in Montreal but registered for an "in-person" course:
- (i) Must live lectures be recorded?
- (ii) Must profs record a separate lecture? NO
- ►Response:
- Students who are registered for an in-person course are expected to attend in-person classes and write in-person evaluations.
- Profs who wish to accommodate students with lecture notes or other material do so at their discretion.
- Students in such a situation could register for courses that are delivered remotely.

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#### ► Response:

- ► At the present time the government has not imposed that students need to be vaccinated.
- The University will be promoting vaccinations.
- There is a plan in place to have a temporary "pop-up" vaccination center on site.

► Concern: What is the mask policy?

#### Some Recent Inquiries by CUPFA Members

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  - Currently, masks are mandatory when on campus in public indoor spaces
  - Dependent on Public Health directives
  - Profs may wear masks and visors in class

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- Short answer: NO
  - So long as there is a pedagogical basis for the delivery plan, one can reduce in-person time and add asynchronous components

#### PERMISSIBLE:

October 6<sup>th</sup> 1.25 hour lecture is asynchronous: that is, a 40 minute lecture on TOPIC 1 and a 35 minute lecture on TOPIC 2 are recorded on Yuja and uploaded to your Moodle course site

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October 8<sup>th</sup> 1.25 hour class time: a pre-assigned text "case" is discussed in class, where discussion incorporates theories and concepts discussed in the recorded October 6<sup>th</sup> lecture (flipped classroom)

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Response: Consult with CUPFA.
